Radiologic Technology Program Application Process

Students interested in applying for Fall 2012 must have their step plans updated to the 2011 version & complete the HESI A2 exam this year.

Exam Sign up: **May 7-14, 2012** (Mon-Fri, during normal business hours at Faculty Workroom reception desk.)

Exam Dates: Tentative dates are May 23 & 30, 2012, 10 am – 12 pm OR 2 – 4 pm.

The study guide for the HESI 2nd ed. is available in the bookstore. You are only required to test in the Anatomy & Physiology and Math modules of the exam. You will receive your score when you finish the exam.

Application Packets will only be available during the HESI exam sign up period and **all students** must pick up the formal application, even if you have already taken the HESI exam. (The HESI can only be taken once a year and the score is valid for up to 2 years.) **Applications & materials must be returned by June 21, 2012 at 4:00 pm** in the Faculty Workroom on the Main Campus. This is a firm deadline and no late materials will be accepted, nor will any incomplete packets.

- * All prerequisites must be completed by the end of Spring 2012 in order to apply for Fall 2012. SCI 211 is the only course that can be completed Summer 2012.

AUTO TECH DEPARTMENT

There are some new things going on in the auto service department. To start with, we have a new class being offered this winter. It is AST 251 "Automatic Transmission and Transaxle". We welcome Bill Anderson, lead instructor, and Bill Weidemann, lab instructor, to our automotive teaching staff.

In addition we have received the following donations:

- Chrysler Corporation has donated a 2011 Jeep Wrangler Rubicon and a 2011 Dodge Durango. The Durango was in the International Auto Show at Cobo Hall last year. It is a cut-a-way vehicle. Body parts have been cut or removed to view the hidden components. What a great learning tool.
- General Motors has donated eight engine stands and two new 2011 V6 drive trains with suspensions from a Buick Enclave.

Come to the lab with your questions and the instructor will help you find the resources to answer your questions, but the instructor will not “Do” your homework or “Give” you the answers.

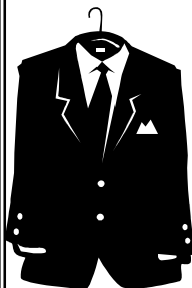

FINANCIAL AID

IT'S TIME TO RE-APPLY FOR FINANCIAL AID FOR THE 2012-2013 SCHOOL YEAR

In order to be awarded Financial Aid (grants and/or loans) for the 2012-2013 school year, complete the 2012-2013 FAFSA ONLINE (Free Application for Federal Student Aid). It is recommended that you submit your application between January 1, 2012 and March 1, 2012.

- ⇒ Make sure you have your PIN (Personal Identification number) in order to electronically sign your application (if dependent your parent must also have a PIN). If you do not have a PIN you may apply for one at www.pin.ed.gov
- ⇒ Have your (and your parent(s), if dependent) 2011 Federal Tax Returns completed before you begin.
- ⇒ Access the correct FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) website: www.FAFSA.gov
- ⇒ List Baker College of Clinton Township as your first college choice. Use our school code of E00462.
- ⇒ Sign your application with your PIN (and parent, if dependent).

Follow up by checking your Solar System. Some students may be required to submit additional information to the Financial Aid Office. If you have difficulty logging into the Solar System, contact the helpdesk at 1-800-645-8530.

BOOKSTORE

Returning Books to the Bookstore

Students have until Saturday, January 28, 2012 to return for refund textbooks sold or rented for Winter 2012 classes. You must bring your original sales receipt. The amount of the refund depends on the condition of the book. There are no book returns after this date for any reason. Other restrictions apply to returns for reference books and non-textbook items.

Cash For Books

Baker College officially recommends that students keep their textbooks. Students sell textbooks at their own risk and will be responsible for replacing, at full value, any book that is used again in an upcoming quarter.

*****DO NOT SELL RENTALS at CASH FOR BOOKS. To avoid penalties, return rented textbooks back to the Bookstore by the deadline.*****

STUDENTS AND SOFTWARE

- The Student License for **Office 2010 Professional** is available at the Bookstore for a great price. You must have Windows XP Service Pack 3 or later to install. Limit one per student—must show valid ID.
- Students may go to www.baker.edu/computing to find a link to **Kaspersky Anti-Virus** that may be purchased at a discount.

IMPORTANT INFO ON WRITING PACKETS

Your writing packet comes with a blue access code card to MYCOMPLAB, an online learning tool from Pearson. Some English classes may require you to use MYCOMPLAB for homework assignments.

As this card is small, easy to lose, and may not be used in all English classes, we recommend that you log in and create a password immediately. Your access is good for four years. We will not be able to refund your writing packet if the access code has been lost, opened or used. If you choose to not create your account immediately, keep track of your MYCOMPLAB access card and do not lose it. If you lose your card, and you need it in the future, contact your instructor—proof of purchase may be necessary. If you need to purchase another card, they are sold only as part of the new writing packet.

Need **Scantrons** in a pinch? There are vending machines in the B Hallway Little Mack Student Center & the Tech Center Student Center that sell them for \$1.25 per six-pack. Scantrons are also available at the Bookstore and Student Shop. If you have trouble with a vending machine, contact the Bookstore or Student Shop for remedy.

CONNECT CARDS

Textbooks sold with Connect cards for classes that require them (ACC 121 and SCI 101) must be returned with the Connect card unused, and sealed. If the Connect card is lost or opened, you must purchase a replacement Connect Card, or we will not be able to return the book.

FLASH DRIVES

Like any other temporary storage device, flash drives can fail at any time without warning. Make sure that you also save files on a more permanent storage device. You can try emailing yourself your work to your Baker College Student account.

DID YOU KNOW? Your purchase of the new textbooks for these classes ENG 098, MTH 091, or MTH099e includes your hassle free access to the Pearson Online Learning tools which may include an E-BOOK. If you purchased a textbook that requires hassle free access and were not able to return the book after attending class, you have access and can use the book and online tools if you retake the class as long as they have not changed.

BOOKSTORE

INF AND CIS TEXTBOOK CODES

INF 112, 113, 114, 141, CIS302a & CIS 313 students must return the Pearson Online Access Code UNOPENED in order to return your textbooks for full value during the normal return period. You will not be able to return your textbooks for any value once the access code has been opened. Computer books will have little or no value at the Cash for Books at the end of the quarter.

INF TEXTBOOK MISSING ACCESS CODE: If your INF textbook was missing an access code, the Bookstore will replace it at no charge as long as we can verify your purchase history for the current quarter. If we cannot verify your purchase history for the current quarter, we will only be able to sell you a new textbook. We will not be able to take the old textbook back. NOTE: If you have taken another INF class, you may be able to gain access using the ID and passcode you created for that class.

Be sure to purchase your textbooks and supplies by the middle of week 2 to make sure that F.A. funds are available.

BUSINESS OFFICE

ACTIVATE YOUR BAKERONECARD NOW

Go to www.BakerOneCard.com to activate. Choose how you would like to receive any money owed to you by Baker College:

- Easy Refund to OneAccount = Same day
- ACH Transfer = 2 -3 days
- Paper Check = 5 or more days



This card **MUST BE ACTIVATED** in order to receive any refunds from your student account. Examples include: Financial aid refunds, tuition refunds, or bookstore refunds.

Activate your Baker OneCard now even if you are not expecting a refund.

If you have not received your Baker OneCard, visit www.BakerOneCard.com and click on the "Where's My Card?" link and follow the instructions.

LOAN REFUND POLICY

For Fall loans that have been posted to student accounts, loan refunds will be available after Friday, January 20, 2012. **Availability depends on your Baker OneCard refund preference.** Baker College has partnered with Higher One to provide disbursement services for all financial refunds. Students have three choices as to how they want to receive financial refunds.

Due to federal regulations, loan refunds for NEW students will not be available until after Friday, February 17, 2012.

In order to receive a loan refund:

- You must have completed the loan application through the Financial Aid Office
- You must be attending your classes
- Your loan must be posted to your account

You must have activated your Baker OneCard AND selected a refund preference

A 2nd 5 week or online class may delay your refund. If you have any questions regarding the loan refund policy, please contact the Financial Aid or Business Office.

WINTER 2012 DEFERRED TUITION STUDENTS

Just a reminder to all students planning to use the Deferred Tuition Plan for Winter 2012. See the business office to make sure you have the following on file:

- * Signed deferred agreement for Winter 2012
- * Current tuition reimbursement policy from your employer.

ATM on Campus

The Higher One ATM will be available at the south end of Hallway B at the Little Mack campus. The Talmer ATM will be put back in the new student center once construction is complete.



BUSINESS OFFICE

TUITION REFUND POLICY

The tuition refund policy is based upon the **official notice date and enrollment period**.

NOTE: ABSENTEEISM OR FAILURE TO BEGIN A CLASS DOES NOT REDUCE A STUDENT'S FINANCIAL OBLIGATION.

Official Notice Date

The official notice date is the date the drop/withdrawal form is turned into the Academic Office, the postmarked date of the letter sent to the Academic Office, the date the fax was sent, the date the e-mail was sent, or the date of notice of withdrawal by the College. Refunds will be based on the date of official notice (see Withdrawal from a Class below).

Percentage:

100% Drop – If **official notice date** is before the first day of the **enrollment period** (not class start date).

100% Withdrawal – If **official notice date** is within the first seven days of the **enrollment period** (not class start date).

50% Withdrawal – If **official notice date** is after the first seven days of the **enrollment period** and before the fifteenth day of the enrollment period.

NO REFUND – If **official notice date** is after the fourteenth day of the **enrollment period**.

Enrollment Period:

Enrollment period is determined by the registered class.

On-ground classes: enrollment period begins on the Monday of the week that class begins.

On-line classes: enrollment period begins on the Thursday of the week that class begins.

WITHDRAWING FROM A CLASS?

If you are withdrawing from a class and a financial aid recipient, then you need to know this:

Federal and state regulations determine your eligibility for financial aid based upon your registered credit hours. If you are a recipient of state or federal financial aid, withdrawing from a class could affect the amount of financial aid to which you are entitled. Please see the Financial Aid AND Business offices **before** you officially withdraw from any of your classes to determine the financial impact of the withdrawal.

Baker College is going GREEN. Log on to www.baker.edu to access your account and view your invoices and statements. Go to SOLAR system, then choose STAR system and select "Business Office" at the top.

Tuition is due **Friday, January 6, 2012 or payable in 4 equal payments. Please see the business office for details.**

You may pay your tuition in the *Business Office* during the following hours:

Monday: 8 am to 8:30 pm

Tuesday – Friday: 8 am to 6:00 pm

Payments may be made at the business office during regular business hours or deposited in the drop box located next to the business office.

- ⇒ Monday, February 13th, 2012: Courthouse Tour – Mount Clemens, MI. Fee-Parking tolls (quarters only).

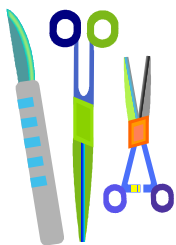
