When Victoria isn't in classes, she is holding down both a full-time and a part-time job. She is also part of

the Student Leadership Council and runs the Human Service Club. The Human Service club currently has two donation drives that could use help. The club is collecting gently used or damaged blankets for the Department of Human Services (DHS). The club is also collecting non-perishable food to make Thanksgiving boxes for families in need. The boxes are used to give families a start on Thanksgiving staples such as boxes of mac n' cheese, canned vegetables, stuffing mix, and other traditional Thanksgiving dishes. Last year the club was able to help 15 families in need. You can donate to either of these drives in the Student Center.

When asked what advice she would give to other students, Victoria says, "It is important to set a goal to guide you. Remember why you are getting your education or who you are doing it for. Let these goals motivate and guide you." Victoria also suggests that students get to know the faculty in their departments. ADVISING & REGISTRATION

REGISTRATION

To access training materials and the registration module:

- 1. Log in to my.baker.edu & click on the My Services tab
- 2. Click on the **My Course Information** link. The <u>How to Register</u> button and the <u>Registration</u> button will be on the left side of the screen. (We strongly encourage you to view the training materials located under the <u>How</u> <u>to Register</u> button prior to accessing <u>Registration</u>.) Within <u>Registration</u>, you may notice that it says the Add/Drop course period is OPEN even though you are not able to register until the week of Nov. 9th. This is due to administrative testing taking place.
- 3. Once in **Registration**, several course search parameters are available. It is recommended that you only choose the campus you are interested in and enter the **course discipline code** within the <u>Course Code</u> search box without the course number. (Example: choose Clinton Township (CT) and enter ENG instead of ENG 101.) If you prefer to enter the entire course code, be aware that the course number always begins in the sixth character of the field so ENG 101 is entered as ENG space-space 101. Note that all Online courses are accessed by selecting the Online campus. The campus codes are as follows: AH=Auburn Hills, AP=Allen Park, CT=Clinton Township, FL=Flint, OL=Online, PH=Port Huron.

Express Registration

After you meet with an advisor during Week 6 to determine your schedule, you will be given a blue registration card which will permit you to use Express Registration during Week 7.

PASSWORDS

Baker passwords expire 90 days from the day they are created. Up to \$50 in printing & copying/quarter are provided at no charge to you! Additional printing and copying will require students to add money to their Baker ID cards.

Baker will issue printer credit for <u>hardware</u> <u>malfunctions (not user errors) involving ten or</u> <u>more pages;</u> bring the defective pages to the ARC front desk right away if a problem occurs.

Tests/Quizzes:

We provide the following assistance to students who need help with practice tests/quizzes:

• We will work with students on problems similar to those contained in the practice tests/quizzes.

The ARC adopts practices that enable students to develop strategies and skills that promote independent learning and student engagement. Visit the ARC for more information about Testing and Tutoring Services.

It is also important to note that we do not work with students working on takehome tests/quizzes.

Make-Up Testing (Wk-2—9 Only)

Check in process begins 15 minutes prior to testing time, the testing room door closes 2 minutes prior to testing time and late testers will not be permitted entry. Late testers may have the opportunity to test at the next available test time that day if appointments are not all booked.

We do not proctor make-up final exams.

Accommodated Testing (Wk 1-10)

Testing appointments are based on proctor availability and are not scheduled during class times.

Waiver Testing (Wk 2-10)

Waiver testing is by appointment only and scheduled at least 24 hours in advance in the ARC. Time based on proctor availability.

FINANCIAL SERVICES

FINANCIAL AID

Now that the Fall quarter has started, it is time to review your financial aid to ensure that all necessary steps are complete to cover the cost of tuition and books. You can review your account in the SOLAR/STAR system to go over all important information.

♦ Are there missing items that must be turned in?

- ♦ Does a loan request form need to be submitted?
- ♦ After looking at the award is there enough funds to cover tuition and books?

If you have not completed your FAFSA application, there is still time. You may apply at www.FAFSA.gov and you must have a <u>user ID</u> & <u>password</u> to log in (parents of dependent students must also have a user id and password).

Students must apply for financial aid every year. As we approach the end of this year and the beginning of a new year, please add to your January 2016 calendar: "*Apply for financial aid for 2016-2017 school year as early as possible!*"

LOANS

Funds are disbursed between week 3 and week 10. Financial Services is unable to give specific dates funds will be disbursed, due to the many variables that can affect loan eligibility (i.e. attendance, withdrawals, promissory note, entrance, etc.). Students will receive email notification, so please check your account frequently.

Loan Refund Policy

For Fall loans that have been posted to student accounts, loan refunds will be available after Tuesday, October 13. Availability depends on your Baker OneCard refund preference. Baker College has partnered with Higher One to provide disbursement services for all financial refunds. Students have three choices as to how they want to receive financial refunds.

Due to federal regulations, loan refunds for NEW students will not be available until after Tuesday, November 10.

In order to receive a loan refund:

- * You must have completed the loan application through the Financial Services Office
- * You must be attending your classes
- * Your loan must be posted to your account and have created a credit on your student account
- * You must have activated your Baker OneCard AND selected a refund preference

A 2nd 5 week or online class may delay your refund. If you have any questions regarding the loan refund policy, please contact the Financial Services Office.

Remember that loans & grants are both considered financial aid.

Loans are federal funds that must be paid back.

<u>Third Party Student</u> <u>Reminder</u>

If your employer issues a voucher authorizing the payment of your tuition, please turn the voucher in to the Financial Services Office by November 6, 2015. All charges are the responsibility of the student until the employer's payment is received by Baker College.

It is very important that you meet with a Financial Aid Advisor & Academic Advisor if you are planning on withdrawing/ changing program/ retaking a class as this could impact future financial aid eligibility. It could also impact the balance owed.

FALL 2015 DEFERRED TUITION STUDENTS

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All students planning to use the Deferred Tuition plan for Fall 2015 should see the Financial Services Office to make sure the following is on file:

- ⇒ Signed deferred agreement for FALL 2015.
- ⇒ Current tuition reimbursement policy from your employer.
