Academic Registration and Advising

Students may register for classes in the Student Center on February 24-26, from 9:30 a.m.—3 p.m. and 5 p.m.—6:15 p.m. Academic/Program advisors will be available in the Student Center at scheduled times on February 25 and 26. Most will be available in their offices on February 24. Registration will be available in the Academic Center and by telephone beginning at 8 a.m. on Thursday, February 27.

Registration for summer and fall classes begins May 19.

Winter Weather Alerts

In the event the College must close due to inclement weather, communication is sent via several avenues. First, students may call the weather hotline at 231-777-6666 for a recorded message concerning any closings. Second, a message is posted on the College web site at www.baker.edu. Third, area television and radio stations are contacted. Finally, students are notified via telephone, text message and email through the Baker College Emergency Notification System.

Every effort is made to communicate closing information quickly. The College is very aware that students have to make important travel and daycare decisions based upon weather closings. Furthermore, the College is aware that conditions vary in surrounding areas. Students must contact their teachers if they are unable to get to school due to inclement weather. An absence will be recorded, if classes are in session.

STUDENT DRESS CODE

Students are reminded to review the contents of the Student Handbook and the Baker College Catalog to become familiar with policies and procedures affecting students. A number of policies have been established to create and maintain a comfortable and safe learning environment for all students while they are on campus.

An excerpt from the Student Handbook states:
"Students are to dress in conventional attire that
exhibits good taste. In instances of unsuitable
dress, faculty or staff may request that the
student leave the classroom or facility."

The College considers the following apparel to be "unsuitable dress":

- 1. Halter tops
- 2. Strapless tops or tube tops
- 3. One-strap/one-shoulder tops
- 4. Tops that expose the bare midriff
- 5. Low-cut tops or plunging necklines
- 6. Very short skirts
- 7. Very short shorts
- 8. Low-ride pants that expose flesh
- 9. Low-ride pants that expose underwear
- 10. Jeans or pants with slashes/cuts that expose flesh or underwear
- 11. Hats or shirts with offensive or vulgar wording or pictures.
- 12. Bare feet
- 13. Rollerblades

Adherence to the dress code is part of developing professional behavior and contributes to a professional learning environment.

TUITION REFUND POLICY

Tuition refunds are calculated based on the date the College is notified in writing of class withdrawal, not the last date of attendance. Please refer to the College catalog or student handbook for refund percentages.

Although the tuition refund period lasts the first two weeks of a class, it takes a longer amount of time to earn financial aid (grants and loans). Withdrawing from a class may result in a reduction of grants and loans and may affect future financial aid eligibility.

Please check with the Financial Services Department before you consider withdrawing from a class. Financial Services can help you avoid costly mistakes which could prevent you from registering in the future and accomplishing your educational goals.

WHAT IS A BAKER ONECARD?

The Baker OneCard is how Baker College delivers money to students. ANY credit balance owed to you by Baker College will be handled through the Baker OneCard. It is not just for financial aid refunds.

- How do you receive money for a book you returned?
- How do you get your excess loan funds?
- Where is your refund for tuition you paid and then later dropped the class?

The answer is your Baker OneCard.

The Baker OneCard is not a credit card. When you go to www.Baker OneCard.com to activate the card, there are three options for delivery of your funds. First, you may choose to have the funds sent to another bank account. Second, you may request funds be sent to you by paper check via US Mail. The third option is to create a OneAccount.

The **OneAccount** can be used for fee-free banking. You may access your funds through the ATM located outside the Baker College Bookstore. If you establish a OneAccount, the Baker OneCard may be used to "swipe and sign" for purchases at most retailers. There are fees for PIN based transactions and some services. Please see a complete list of banking fees at www.BakerOneCard.com.

The OneAccount PREMIER and the OneAccount **EDGE** are enhanced accounts which have monthly fees and are NOT considered "fee-free banking" like the basic OneAccount. These two options are designed for students who plan to

make their own deposits to their accounts (in addition to any Baker refunds) and use the account for their primary banking needs. A monthly fee is charged.

Whichever option you choose, remember to activate your Baker OneCard as soon as you receive it. Assistance is always available in Financial Services.

WINTER INVOICES

Invoices for Winter quarter charges were sent electronically the week of January 14. Your invoice is ready for viewing and printing from the Baker website at https://carina.baker.edu/solar. Sign in with your current user ID and password to access the invoice. Please contact the Financial Services Department if you have questions about obtaining your invoice or how to make payments on your account.

Reminder: You are responsible for payment of your balance due. However, if a parent, employer, friend or some other awesome person is paying your Winter balance, be sure to give them this information.

It is important to be aware of your account balance. A \$30 Finance Charge will be applied to all unpaid accounts on February 28.

When Will I Receive My Loan Refund?

In an effort to provide exemplary customer service to Baker College of Muskegon students, an e-mail notification will be sent to each student when a loan refund is available (i.e. BakerOne Card, paper check). Student loan refunds are typically available to students during Weeks 3-10 of each quarter. This date

could vary depending on whether a student has completed Entrance Loan Counseling, a Direct Loan Master Promissory Note, maintained satisfactory attendance in current quarter classes, submitted all missing items and started the required minimum amount of six (6) credit hours

for the current guarter. Students are encouraged to communicate with creditors such as landlords, utility companies, etc., to request patience because 4. Select "Financial Aid Office" a refund may be received at any time during Weeks 3-10 of the quarter.

ONLINE ALL THE TIME

Students can check the status of their Financial Aid online 24/7 which may eliminate the need to call/stop by the Financial Aid Office.
