Begin Planning Your Spring Class Schedule

REGISTRATION FOR SPRING 2014

Registration for the 2014 spring quarter begins Monday, February 24, and you are encouraged to contact your academic or program director **TODAY** to schedule an appointment. They will be available in the Student Center on a limited schedule, between February 24-26.

View/Print your STEP Plan/Rotation online @ www.baker.edu (SOLAR System). Registration cards will also be available in the Student Center, February 24-26.

Your preparations for Week 7 registration may need to include a visit to the Financial

Services Office prior to registration, to ensure your account is current and paid in full. Students who owe a balance will not be allowed to register, until they see the Financial Services Office to make payment arrangements.

Registration during Week 7 is based upon total credits completed. Students may register in the Student Center based upon the following criteria:

Monday, February 24: Tuesday, February 25: Wednesday, February 26:

- **30+** credits completed
- **13+** credits completed
- 0+ credits completed

Students who have completed at least 12+ credits may also register online at <u>www.baker.edu</u> based upon the same credit hour limits listed above. Winter classes DO NOT COUNT as part of the total credits completed.

Telephone and Walk-In Registration Begins February 27

Students may register by telephone or in person at the Academic Center beginning at 8 a.m. on Thursday, February 27. Telephone and walk-in registration continues through the start of the spring quarter on April 7.

Registration services are available <u>ONLY</u> in the STUDENT CENTER from February 24-26.

REGISTER FOR SPRING ON-LINE CLASSES! Registration for spring quarter on-line classes begins Monday, February 24, in the Student Center or via www.baker.edu based on credit hours completed.

Remember to complete the on-line orientation process ahead of time if you have never taken an on-line class.

LAST DAY TO DROP CLASSES

A student may withdraw from a course up to the end of the week which precedes the final week of the course. The last day to drop a <u>**10-week class**</u> for the 2014 winter quarter is Friday, March 14.

SCHOLARSHIPS AVAILABLE FROM MARY FREE BED GUILD

MINORITY SCHOLARSHIP ~ The Mary Free Bed Guild has established annual scholarships for minority students pursuing degrees in nursing, physical therapy, occupational therapy, speech language pathology, therapeutic recreation, or neuropsychology. The scholarship amounts will vary depending on individual needs. Some of the eligibility requirements are:

- Cumulative college GPA of 3.0 or better;
- Currently enrolled in one of the before mention programs; and
- Must be a permanent resident of the West Michigan area.

DISABILITY SCHOLARSHIP ~ The Mary Free Bed Guild has one-year scholarships for students with disabilities pursuing a post-secondary degree. Criteria are as follows:

- Must possess a diagnosed physical disability related to a brain injury, spinal cord injury, stroke, limb difference, or overcoming any other serious acquired or congenital neurological condition treatable through rehabilitation;
- Demonstrate a commitment to serving diverse populations;
- Must possess a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or better;
- Must be able to competitively apply oneself in the desired field of study, potentially with reasonable accommodations;
- Must have a permanent residency in the West Michigan area;
- Must be currently enrolled in or accepted into an accredited college at least half-time; and
- Must be a citizen of the United States.

A Bill of Assertive Rights

Don't be afraid to say "no" or make your feelings known to aggressive roommates, peers, or co-workers. You make yourself a victim, and your self-esteem is diminished, when you don't stand up for yourself. When you <u>respectfully</u> (firmly but gently) stand up for yourself, you are not responsible for the thoughts and feelings of the other person. It is then up to that person to determine how he or she will behave. The following is a "Bill of Assertive Rights":

You have...

- The right to be treated with respect.
- The right to have and express your own feelings and opinions.
- The right to be taken seriously.
- The right to say no without guilt.
- The right to set your own priorities.
- The right to ask for what you want.
- The right to change your mind.
- The right to say, "I don't know."
- The right to ask for more time before making a decision.
- The right to make mistakes.
- The right to take responsibility for your own behavior, thoughts, and actions.
- The right to choose not to assert yourself.

FINANCIAL SERVICES NEWS SPRING QUARTER REGISTRATION

ACCOUNT BALANCES MUST BE PAID IN FULL PRIOR TO REGISTERING. Take time BEFORE Academic Advising to look at your Baker College account. Check your account information online at www.baker.edu. If there is a balance due on your account, you will NOT be able to register for Spring classes until the balance is paid in full.

If your balance due is the result of pending financial aid (grants, loans, scholarships), you will not be able to register until your financial aid is complete *and* applied to your account. DON'T DELAY! Now is the time to clear up any payments or financial aid which is still pending.

Winter tuition is due February 21. A finance charge of \$30 will be added to unpaid accounts on February 28.
