are no book returns after the
third week of classes for any
reason. Other restrictions
apply to returns for
reference books and nontextbook items.

Need **Scantrons** in a pinch? There are vending machines in the B Hallway Little Mack Student Center & the Tech Center Student Center that sell them for \$1.25 per six-pack. Scantrons are also available at the Bookstore and Student Shop. If you have trouble with a vending machine, contact the Bookstore or Student Shop for remedy.

CONNECT CARDS

Textbooks sold with Connect cards for classes that require them (ACC 121 and SCI 101) must be returned with the Connect card unused, and sealed. If the Connect card is lost or opened, you must purchase a replacement Connect Card, or we will not be able to return the book.

FLASH DRIVES

Like any other temporary storage device, flash drives can fail at any time without warning. Make sure that you also save files on a more permanent storage device. You can try emailing yourself your work to your Baker College Student account.

Students and Software

- The Student License for **Office 2010 Professional** is available at the Bookstore for a great price. You must have Windows XP Service Pack 3 or later to install. Limit one per student—must show valid ID.
- Students may go to www.baker.edu/computing to find a link to **Kaspersky Anti-Virus** that may be purchased at a discount.

INF 112, 113, 114, 141, CIS302a & CIS 313 students must return the Pearson Online Access Code UNOPENED in order to return textbooks for full value during the normal return period. You will not be able to return your textbooks for any value once the access code has been opened. Computer books will have little or no value at Cash for Books at the end of the quarter.

INF TEXTBOOK MISSING ACCESS CODE: If your INF textbook was missing an access code, the Bookstore will replace it at no charge as long as we can verify your purchase history for the current quarter. If we cannot verify your purchase history for the current quarter, we will only be able to sell you a new textbook. We will not be able to take the old textbook back. NOTE: If you have taken another INF class, you may be able to gain access using the ID and passcode you created for that class.

IMPORTANT INFO ON WRITING PACKETS

Your writing packet comes with a blue access code card to MYCOMPLAB, an online learning tool from Pearson. Some English classes may require you to use MYCOMPLAB for homework assignments. As this card is small, easy to lose, and may not be used in all English classes, we recommend that you log in and create a password immediately. Your access is good for four years. We will not be able to refund your writing packet if the access code has been lost, opened or used. If you choose not to create your account immediately, keep track of your MYCOMPLAB access card and do not lose it. If you lose your card and you need it in the future, contact your instructor—proof of purchase may be necessary. If you need to purchase another card, they are sold only as part of the new writing packet.



Tuition

Tuition is due Friday, March 30, 2012 or

payable in 4 equal payments. Please see the business office for details.

You may pay your tuition in the Business Office during the following hours: Mon. 8am to 8:30pm Tues.-Fri. 8am to 6pm.

Payments may be made at the business office during regular business hours or deposited in the drop box located next to the business office.

New paperless invoice/statement service

Invoices and statements will now be available on the Baker College website.

You will receive monthly email notifications to remind you to view and print your invoice/ statement.

Log on to www.baker.edu to access your account. Go to SOLAR system. Select STAR system. Select "Business Office" at the top.

Payment on the web is also available.

NOTE: Please ensure that email from Baker College is not marked SPAM and forwarded to your trash.

ACTIVATE YOUR BAKER ONECARD NOW

To activate, go to www.BakerOneCard.com and choose how you would like to receive any money owed to you by Baker College:

Easy Refund to OneAccount = Same day

ACH Transfer = 2-3 days

Paper Check = 5 or more days

This card **must be activated** in order to receive any refunds from your student account. (Such as financial aid refunds, tuition or bookstore refunds.)

Activate your Baker OneCard now, even if you are not expecting a refund.

If you have not received your Baker OneCard, visit www.BakerOneCard.com and click on the "Where's My Card?" link and follow the instructions.

LOAN REFUND POLICY

For Spring loans that have been posted to student accounts, loan refunds will be available after Friday, April 13, 2012. **Availability depends on your Baker OneCard refund preference.** Baker College has partnered with Higher One to provide disbursement services for all financial refunds. Students have three choices as to how they want to receive financial refunds.

Due to federal regulations, loan refunds for NEW students will not be available until after Friday, May 11, 2012.

In order to receive a loan refund:

- * You must have completed the loan application through the Financial Aid Office
- * You must be attending your classes
- * Your loan must be posted to your account
- * You must have activated your Baker OneCard AND selected a refund preference

A 2nd 5 week or online class may delay your refund. If you have any questions regarding the loan refund policy, please contact the Financial Aid or Business Office.

SPRING 2012 DEFERRED TUITION STUDENTS

Just a reminder to all students planning to use the Deferred Tuition Plan for Spring 2012, see the Business Office to make sure you have the following on file:

- 1. Signed deferred agreement for Spring 2012
- 2. Current tuition reimbursement policy from your employer.

BUSINESS OFFICE

Tuition Refund Policy

The tuition refund policy is based upon the official notice date and enrollment period. Note: absenteeism or failure to begin a class does not reduce a student's financial obligation.

The **Official Notice Date** is the date the drop/withdrawal form is turned in to the Academic Office, the postmarked date of the letter sent to the Academic Office, the date the fax was sent, the date the email was sent, or the date of notice of withdrawal by the College. Refunds will be based on the date of official notice.

Percentage:

100% Drop—If official notice date is before the first day of the enrollment period (not class start date).

100% Withdrawal—If official notice date is within the first seven days of the enrollment period (not class start date).

50% Withdrawal—If official notice date is after the first seven days of the enrollment period and before the fifteenth day of the enrollment period.

NO REFUND—If official notice date is after the fourteenth day of the enrollment period.

Enrollment Period is determined by the registered class.

On-ground classes: enrollment period begins on the Monday of the week that class begins.

On-line classes: enrollment period begins on the Thursday of the week that class begins.

WITHDRAWING FROM A CLASS & RECEIVING FINANCIAL AID Federal and state regulations determine your eligibility for financial aid based upon your registered credit hours. If you are a recipient of state or federal financial aid. withdrawing from a class could affect the amount of financial aid to which you are entitled.

Please see the Financial Aid AND Business offices **before** you officially withdraw from any of your classes to determine the financial impact of the withdrawal.

WRITING CENTER

The Writing Center is a place for students to meet with tutors (Baker's writing experts) for assistance with their ideas, assignments, and essays. The Writing Center staff is there to support students with any phase of the writing process (brainstorming, drafting, etc.) as well as provide assistance writing papers for any class. The atmosphere is casual and relaxed, so make an appointment to meet with one of our writing experts today!

The Writing Center is located in D-108 on the Main Campus and is open Weeks 2-9 Fall, Winter, and Spring Quarter, and Weeks 2-8 Summer Quarter. FINANCIAL AID

Financial Aid 2012-2013

HAVE YOU APPLIED FOR FINANCIAL AID FOR THE 2012-2013 SCHOOL YEAR? In order to be awarded financial aid, students need to complete the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) online application EVERY YEAR.

Access the correct FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) website:

If you do not have a PIN (Personal Identification Number) you may apply for one at

WWW.PIN.ED.GOV.

Note: If you already applied and marked will file taxes and now have filed, you will receive notification from the Department of Education to go back into the FAFSA application and use the IRS DATA RETREIVAL option to update your information.

Some students may be required to submit additional information and will be contacted by the Financial Aid office.

LOAN REFUND INFORMATION

- In an effort to provide exemplary customer service to Baker College of Clinton Twp students, an e-mail notification will be sent to each student when a loan refund is available (i.e. BakerOne Card, paper check).
- Student loan refunds are typically available to students during weeks 3-10 of each quarter.
- This date could vary depending on whether a student has completed Entrance Loan Counseling, a Direct Loan Master Promissory Note, maintained satisfactory attendance in current quarter classes, submitted all missing items, started the required minimum amount of six (6) credit hours for the current quarter and met the required delay for first-year, first-time borrowers.
- Students are encouraged to communicate with creditors such as landlords, utility companies, etc., to request patience because a refund may be received at anytime during weeks 3-10 of the quarter.

ONLINE ALL THE TIME

Students can check the status of their Financial Aid on line 24/7 which may eliminate the need to call/stop by the Financial Aid Office.

LIMITED ENROLLMENT PROGRAMS

RADIOLOGIC TECHNOLOGY PROGRAM

<u>All students</u> may pick up their formal program application form April 2, 2012 – May 4, 2012 at the Health Sciences Office (A 105) during normal business hours.

The HESI exam sign up will be held April 9, 2012 – May 4, 2012 Monday-Friday during normal business hours at the Faculty workroom reception desk. The Radiography HESI A2 exam will be <u>May 23 and May 25</u> 10:00AM - 12PM OR 2:00PM – 4:00PM. The study guide for the HESI 2nd Edition is available in the campus bookstore. The HESI exam is a basic assessment test which has eight modules, but you will only need to complete two of them. The required modules include anatomy and physiology and math. You will receive your score when you finish the exam. *Note Students may only sit for this exam once each application cycle (year). The score received can be used for up to 2 years. *Note All students must complete all prerequisite courses by the <u>end of Spring Quarter</u> for the year that they are applying, as stated in the 2011 Health Science Catalog Supplement, in order to be eligible to apply. If you plan on taking an Online course that is required for application, it must not be taken in the second session, as the grades in second session are not posted until 10 days beyond the end of the quarter of on-ground classes. *SCI 211 Pathophysiology is the only prerequisite course that can be completed in the summer 2012 semester.*

If you have any questions related to the program please refer to the *2011 Health Science Catalog Supplement or contact the Program Director*. **Note All application materials* must be returned by Friday, **May 4, 2012 by 5:00 PM** in the Health Sciences Office (A 105). This is a firm deadline and no late materials will be accepted, nor will any incomplete packets.

Surgical Technology Program

The 2012-2013 Surgical Technology Program application process will take place during **WEEKS 1 through 5** of the Spring term.

Application Packets must be signed for at the time of pick-up. Completed applications need to be returned to the Health Sciences Office in person during week 5, April 30, 2012 through the close of business Friday, May 4, 2012. All prerequisites must be completed by the end of the spring term. Students **MUST NOT TAKE** an Online prerequisite course during the second session, or their applications will not be considered. Students will be notified week 11 of the results of their application. Students are i required to use their Baker College email account. The 2012-2013 Surgical Technology Cohort begins on Tuesday, June 26, 2012.

LIMITED ENROLLMENT PROGRAMS

PRE-NURSING STUDENTS

You **must** update your program version to 2011A and/or have completed the additional requirements indicated in order to apply. You may meet with an Academic Advisor to update your version at any time and obtain information regarding the additional requirements below.

HSC 151: Intro to Electronic Health Records (2 credits). Two sections will be offered Spring term. If the class is full, you may substitute this course with an INF course for Spring 2012 applications only, due to limited availability. (You will receive training on the Electronic Health Records in the nursing curriculum.)

SCI 131: Concepts of Microbiology (2 credits). SCI 220A may be substituted; see the Academic Office to complete the proper documentation. One section will be offered Spring term at this time.

IMPORTANT: You cannot take an Online course the second session of the quarter of application, as grades for this course are not posted until 10 days beyond the end of the on-ground term.

KAPLAN Admission Test:

Registration: Mon. April 2—Mon. April 30. Register in the Health Sciences Office (A105) with your student ID. Note: Campus is closed Friday, April 6 for Good Friday.

Test: The test will be offered on Saturday, May 12 & May 19 from 8:00am—12:00pm & 1:00—5:00pm.
