TUITION REFUND POLICY

The tuition refund policy is based upon the official notice date and enrollment period. NOTE: ABSENTEEISM OR FAILURE TO BEGIN A CLASS DOES NOT REDUCE A STUDENT'S FINANCIAL OBLIGATION.

Official Notice Date

The official notice date is the date the drop/withdrawal form is turned into the Academic Office, the postmarked date of the letter sent to the Academic Office, the date the fax was sent, the date the e-mail was sent, or the date of notice of withdrawal by the College. Refunds will be based on the date of official notice of withdrawal.

Percentage:

100% Drop – If official notice date is before the first day of the enrollment period (not class start date). 100% Withdrawal – If official notice date is within the first seven days of the enrollment period (not class start date). 50% Withdrawal – If official notice date is after the first seven days of the enrollment period and before the Fifteenth day of the enrollment period.

NO REFUND – If official notice date is after the fourteenth day of the enrollment period.

Enrollment Period:

Enrollment period is determined by the registered class.

On-ground classes: enrollment period begins on the Monday of the week that class begins. On-line classes: enrollment period begins on the Thursday of the week that class begins.

Loan Refund Policy

For Fall loans that have been posted to student accounts, loan refunds will be available after Tuesday, October 13, 2015. Availability depends on your Baker OneCard refund preference. Baker College has partnered with Higher One to provide disbursement services for all financial refunds. Students have three choices as to how they want to receive financial refunds.

Due to federal regulations, loan refunds for NEW students will not be available until after Tuesday, November 10, 2015.

In order to receive a loan refund:

- You must have completed the loan application through the Financial Services Office
- You must be attending your classes
- Your loan must be posted to your account and have created a credit on your student account
- You must have activated your Baker OneCard AND selected a refund preference

A 2nd 5 week or online class may delay your refund. If you have any questions regarding the loan refund policy, please contact the Financial Services Office.

WITHDRAWING FROM CLASS AND HAVE FINANCIAL AID?

Federal and state regulations determine your eligibility for financial aid based upon your registered credit hours. If you are a recipient of state or federal financial aid, withdrawing from a class could affect the amount of financial aid to which you are entitled. Please see the Financial Services Office before you officially withdraw from any of your classes to determine the financial impact of the withdrawal.

REMINDER: FALL 2015 DEFERRED TUITION STUDENTS

All students planning to use the Deferred Tuition plan for Fall 2015 should see the Financial Services Office to make sure the following is on file:

- Signed deferred agreement for FALL 2015.
- <u>Current</u> tuition reimbursement policy from your employer.

FAFSA ID:

Just a reminder that if you are applying for Financial Aid for 15-16, a FAFSA User ID and Password must be created. <u>The PIN numbers are no longer valid</u>. If you are a dependent student, your parent must also create a User ID and Password.

If you already applied for 2015-2016, please log on to Solar/Star to view your information and respond to any important messages.

To avoid delays at the bookstore always review your Financial Aid account.

- Is my Financial Aid complete?
- Do I need to submit additional information?
- Do I have enough funds to cover tuition and books for fall/winter/spring?
- Do I need to request a student loan?
- Do I need to complete a Promissory Note and Entrance Counseling?

You may access your account at www.baker.edu anytime.

SAP Measurements

In order for students to receive federal, state, or institutional aid, regulations require that students maintain satisfactory academic progress toward completion of their current academic program. All students will have their progress reviewed, whether or not they are receiving financial aid, since these rules decide eligibility for future quarters. There are three academic standards that all students are required to maintain in order to remain eligible for future financial aid assistance. The standards required to maintain eligibility for financial aid are: Grade Point Average (GPA), Pace, and Maximum Timeframe. In addition, students must be accepted for continued enrollment under the policies defined in the Baker College catalog.

To Activate Your Baker OneCard:

Visit <u>www.BakerOneCard.com</u> Choose how you would like to receive any money owed to you by Baker College.

- Easy Refund to OneAccount = Same day
- ACH transfer = 2-3 days
- Paper Check = 5 or more days

The card MUST BE ACTIVATED to receive any refunds from your student account. Examples include: financial aid refunds, tuition refunds, or bookstore refunds.

Activate your Baker OneCard now, even if you are not expecting a refund. If you have not received your Baker OneCard, visit <u>www.BakerOneCard.</u>com & click on "Where's My Card?". Follow the instructions.



GRADUATION SPEECH BY STUDENT TIERA ROBINSON

Good morning President Torline, deans, faculty, distinguished guests, family, friends, and fellow graduates.

Behavioral scientist and best-selling author, Dr. Steve Maraboli encourages us to "Let today be the day we stop being haunted by the ghost of yesterday. Holding on [to] grudges, harboring anger and resentment are poisonous to the soul." He continues, "Get even with people, but not those who hurt us, forget them, instead, get even with those who have helped us."

I chose to matriculate into Baker College of Clinton Township because I knew what I wanted. I wanted a great higher education experience. I wanted to be treated like a human being. I wanted to be taught by men and women who experienced what they were teaching. I wanted a challenge and a chance to expand my brain. I wanted a rigorous curriculum with instructors who cared and understood what "life happens" really means.

I would like to thank all of the instructors for accommodating us--mothers, fathers, graveyard-shift workers, homeless, unemployed students, to the best of your power without doing so unethically. **FOR THAT I THANK YOU!**

Furthermore, I knew I needed extra help until I better understood what college life was really about. I knew what I was looking for. Baker College was where I received the tools I needed to succeed in the real work world. I knew I needed

genuine greetings, as I tackled a seemingly far-fetched goal. I received such genuineness. FOR THAT I THANK YOU!

For four active years--I, just as many of you, have overcome hurdles-heartache, job loss, crisis, childcare issues, transportation issues, and even deaths. For me, not just a familial death, but unfortunately the death of my mother--my support system and my friend. Four years of such agony, and stumbling blocks did "Baker College was where I received the tools I needed to succeed in the real work world."

not stop me! Those hardships only built my endurance, immunity, and strength. All odds were against me, a welfare recipient--after losing my job due to my son's medical emergency. I overcame such hardships.

Baker College appeared to me as hope; hope in my stereotypical, statistical situation--a single black teenage mother of three kids. By the way, did you know you were sitting next to me--whom society deemed a statistic?

I knew attending Baker would increase my confidence, self-esteem and drive, diminishing fears that held me captive. Attending Baker turned a young introverted adult into a more caring extrovert. I blossomed in its classrooms. I have watched many of you blossom as well. Most of us shed tears, for both disappointments and accomplishments. We were faced with many challenges. It was then we realized how capable we really were—


SEE HOW CAPABLE WE ARE?
