

# REMINDER: WINTER 2014 TUITION

Tuition is due Friday, January 10, 2014 or is payable in 4 equal payments. Please see the Business Office for details.

Payments may be made at the business office during regular business hours, deposited in the drop box located next to the business office or paid online at www.baker.edu.

# Tuition Refund Policy

The tuition refund policy is based upon the official notice date and enrollment period. NOTE: ABSENTEEISM OR FAILURE TO BEGIN A CLASS DOES NOT REDUCE A STUDENT'S FINANCIAL OBLIGATION.

#### Official Notice Date

The official notice date is the date the drop/withdrawal form is turned in to the Academic Office, the postmarked date of the letter sent to the Academic Office, the date the fax was sent, the date the e-mail was sent, or the date of notice of withdrawal by the College. Refunds will be based on the date of official notice (see the Withdrawal from a Couse section of the Baker Catalog).

#### Percentage:

100% Drop – If **official notice date** is before the first day of the **enrollment period** (not class start date).

100% Withdrawal – If **official notice date** is within the first seven days of the **enrollment period** (not class start date).

50% Withdrawal – If **official notice date** is after the first seven days of the **enrollment period** and before the Fifteenth day of the enrollment period.

NO REFUND – If **official notice date** is after the fourteenth day of the **enrollment period**.

#### **Enrollment Period:**

Enrollment period is determined by the registered class.

**On-ground classes:** enrollment period begins on the Monday of the week that class begins.

**On-line classes:** enrollment period begins on the Thursday of the week that class begins.

#### WINTER 2014 DEFERRED TUITION STUDENTS

All students planning to use the Deferred Tuition plan for WINTER 2014 should see the Business Office to make sure the following is on file:

Please take a moment to verify that the e-mail address we have on file for you is correct and update it if necessary.

#### WITHDRAWING FROM A CLASS AND FINANCIAL AID

Federal and state regulations determine your eligibility for financial aid based upon your registered credit hours. If you are a recipient of state or federal financial aid, withdrawing from a class could affect the amount of financial aid to which you are entitled. Please see the Financial Aid AND Business offices **before** you officially withdraw from any of your classes to determine the financial impact of the withdrawal.

# LOAN REFUND POLICY

For Winter loans that have been posted to student accounts, loan refunds will be available after Friday, January 24, 2014. **Availability depends on your Baker OneCard refund preference.** Baker College has partnered with Higher One to provide disbursement services for all financial refunds. Students have three choices as to how they want to receive financial refunds.

Due to federal regulations, loan refunds for NEW students will not be available until after Friday, February 21, 2014.

In order to receive a loan refund:

- You must have completed the loan application through the Financial Aid Office
- You must be attending your classes
- Your loan must be posted to your account and have created a credit on your student account

You must have activated your Baker OneCard AND selected a refund preference

A 2<sup>nd</sup> 5 week or online class may delay your refund. If you have any questions regarding the loan refund policy, please contact the Financial Aid or Business Office.

# CENSUS DATE

Baker College uses the census date to determine a student's enrollment status for awarding Pell Grant funds.

# SUMMER QUARTER FINANCIAL AID

Financial aid is awarded only for the Fall, Winter, and Spring quarters of the academic year. If you are planning on attending Summer 2014, please see a financial aid advisor to determine if you have remaining aid to attend Summer Quarter. Loans that are received during Fall, Winter and/or Spring quarter may affect your eligibility to receive loan funds for Summer quarter.

# Welcome to the New Year!

Important things to remember for the new 2014-2015 school year which begins September, 2014:

- \* Apply for Financial Aid again. Students must apply for Financial Aid every year.
- \* Computers are available in the Financial Aid office to use for the application process.
- Students should consider applying as early as January for 2014—2015 school year. It is recommended that students submit their application between January 1, 2014 and March 1, 2014.
- \* Complete your taxes as early as possible, in order to use the IRS DATA retrieval link to facilitate the awarding process.
- Access the correct website at <u>WWW.FAFSA.GOV</u>
- \* Have your PIN (personal identification number) in order to electronically sign your application (if you are a dependent, your parent must also have a PIN). You may retrieve or apply for a PIN at <a href="https://www.PIN.ED.GOV"><u>WWW.PIN.ED.GOV</u></a>.
- List Baker College of Clinton Township as your first college choice. Use our school code of E00462.
- \* Please follow up with the Financial Aid Office if you have any issues or questions.


